ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Exact Path for Reading, Language and Math

Grades 2-5: Aug 23 – Sept 3, Sept 22 - Oct 8, Jan 10 – 21, Mar 21 – April 1

Exact Path is administered locally to all students in Grades 2-5 as a benchmarking assessment. It is administered four times per year and measures a range of basic reading skills including foundational skills, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension and math. Results are shared with parents/guardians at the first parent teacher conference in September and each parent teacher conference throughout the school year.

Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP)- TNReady

Grades 3-5: April 18 - May 6

TCAP is a group of state-mandated achievement tests given in the areas of English-Language Arts (ELA), Math, and Science to measure student understanding and proficiency of state content standards. Proficiency results from the achievement tests will be communicated to parents via an Individual Performance Report sent home at the start of the following school year. Grade 2 State Assessment

Grade 2: March 14 – April 29

This is an optional state achievement test that measures student proficiency toward content standards in Reading and Math. Results are returned to the district during the summer of the concluding year. Scores will be communicated to parents via an Individual Performance Report sent home at the start of the following school year.

Multi-State Alternative Assessment (MSAA)

Grades 3-5: March 14 - May 6 (tentative)

The MSAA is a state-mandated, alternative assessment for the TCAP Achievement tests in English-Language Arts and Math. It is designed for students with the most severe cognitive disabilities. Students who will participate in this assessment will have it documented in their Individualized Education Program (IEP). Parents will receive a report of the results of this assessment with explanations of proficiency levels.

Tennessee Comprehensive Achievement Program Alternative Assessment (TCAP-Alt)

Grades 2-5: March 14 – May 6 (tentative)

Students with the most severe cognitive disabilities will participate in the state-mandated TCAP-Alt in Science and Social Studies. Individuals who will participate in this assessment will have it documented in their Individualized Education Program (IEP). Parents will receive a report of the results of this assessment with explanations of proficiency levels.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Exact Path for Reading, Language and Math

Grades 6-8: Aug 23 – Sept 3, Sept 22 - Oct 8, Jan 10 – 21, Mar 21 – April 1

Exact Path is administered locally to all students in Grades 2-5 as a benchmarking assessment. It is administered four times per year and measures a range of basic reading skills including foundational skills, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension and math. HIGH SCHOOL

ACT

Grade 11: March 15 (Make-up TBA)

The ACT is a state-mandated, diagnostic assessment that measures a student's readiness for college in the areas of English, Math, Reading, and Science. enCASE

Grades 9-12: September 20-October 1, Dec 6 – 17, Feb 28 - March 11

enCase is administered locally to all students in Grades 9-11 as a benchmarking assessment for ELA and Math. It is administered three times per year and measures a range of basic reading skills including foundational skills, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. Results are shared with parents/guardians at the first parent teacher conference in September and each parent teacher conference throughout the school year.

End of Course (EOC) Exams

Grades 9-12: April 18 – May 20

End of Course exams are state-mandated assessments that measure student understanding and proficiency of state content standards in a given course. EOC exams are administered to students enrolled in the following courses: English I, English II, English III, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, U.S.. History, Biology, and Chemistry. Quick Score results of these assessments will be factored into a student's final grade in accordance with T.C.A. §49-1-302 and determined by Stewart County School Board policy. Proficiency results from EOC exams will be communicated to parents via an Individual Performance Report sent home at the start of the following school year.
