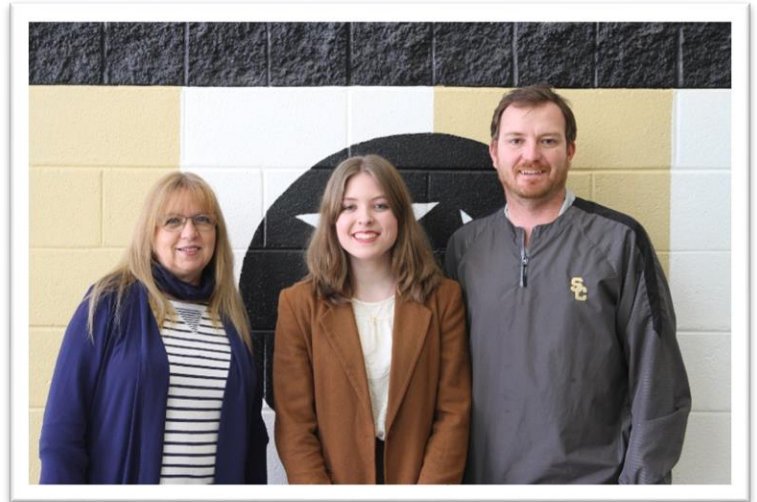


November Student of the Month—Alexandria Anderson
